IV. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Section VIII of the minutes of the March 14, 2018 meeting of the HPC was amended to read that Rachel Muchin-Young, director of the Weyenberg Library, is in the process of creating a research room for local and Wisconsin history and a second research room for Civil War history. Approval of the March 14, 2018 HPC minutes, as amended, was moved by Miller and seconded by Giuliani. Carried unanimously.

A. The Weyenberg Library will also hold an event that day to host a “soft opening” of the two research rooms devoted to local history and the US Civil War.

B. Blazich reported that the Historical Society is interested in working with the Village to explore the feasibility of moving the society’s collection to the second floor of the old firehouse located in the village’s Main Street National Historical District. Chairman Heinritz spoke in favor of exploring the feasibility of relocating the MTHS collection to the historic building and urged MTHS to formally open discussions with the village.
