Honorable Village Board Members,

It is my privilege to present the Thiensville Fire Department Annual Report for 2013 on behalf of the proud men and women of the Department. The year 2013 marked a year of change with Port Washington Fire Department moving to a paramedic level service. Although call volume dipped 11% from 2012, it was far from catastrophic. We were also able to improve our response times averaging 6 minutes from page to scene in the Village. Our average response time remains comparable with full-time departments. We also continued our recruitment efforts to ensure adequate staffing for calls.

The year 2013 was indeed a year of new blood injection into the Department. We hired (9) and retained (8) new members in 2013. Although this number is variable from year to year, 90% retention in the first year exceeds the national volunteer fire service average by 40%! Even with our new staff the average years of service is still an impressive 5.0 years. A very interesting and promising point is that all of these new members joined us as a result of our on-line application available through the Village website.

The members of the Thiensville Fire Department would like to express their heartfelt appreciation for the Village Board's continued support of our mission to provide the best possible Fire and EMS services to our community. Our efforts would not be possible without your support!

# THIENSVILLE FIRE DEPARTMENT ANNUAL REPORT

## **Executive Summary:**

2013 was indeed another year of uncertainty due to the anticipated call drop off associated with the addition of Port Washington's paramedic program going on-line. Even with that impact, TFD still responded to 739 calls for service in 2013 which is only 88 calls fewer than 2012. Cedarburg calls for service were up 18% and Grafton calls for service went up 8% to help offset the impact of Port Washington's paramedic program impact.

We continued our long standing commitment to staff development and continuous improvement by doing training on Rapid Intervention Teams and by beginning training on transitional attack.

With the assistance of some past and present members of the North Shore Fire Department, we conducted a 2-day lecture/practical course on rapid intervention teams last October. The training paralleled Milwaukee County-wide rapid intervention team training. This physically grueling activity taught firefighters how to extricate themselves and down or lost firefighters in high stress circumstances. By the days end, it was apparent that most who participated would be sleeping well that evening!

TFD also began training on transitional fire suppression techniques as a result of a landmark study undertaken by U.L., N.I.S.T. and N.F.P.A. over the last several years. The study was initiated to examine why there is an unprecedented increase in the number of often deadly flashovers across the United States over the past several decades. The study identified several significant contributing factors. The prevalence of petroleum-based synthetics in flooring and furnishings has drastically increased the speed and intensity of fire growth and spread to unprecedented levels. At the same time, traditional fire suppression techniques were inadvertently fueling the fire by providing oxygen to air starved combustibles resulting in disaster to victims and firefighters. Thiensville Fire was the 1<sup>st</sup> department in Ozaukee County to begin implementing transitional attack in response to this landmark study to better improve survivability for the general public and improve safety for firefighters.

EMS training continued in earnest over 2013 covering a wide spectrum of basic life support topics as well as advanced life support topics. All this training was in addition to the State required refreshers that all levels of EMS personnel completed.

Our commitment toward community outreach continued in 2013 ranging from community CPR training, block party visits, support of community car washes, offering rides in fire engines for other community organizations to use as raffle prizes, North Shore Safety Day, TFD and TPD's Public Safety Day, Truck-or-Treat, and Holiday Tree Lighting, to name just a few! The men and women of the TFD often take on these duties without being compensated as a result of their commitment to our great community.



## Education:

### In-House Training Hours At-A-Glance



**Call Response:**


