

CONSTRUCTION NOTICE

Dear Residents and Property Owners:

SUBJECT: Wisconsin DOT Main Street Rehabilitation

Work will start on April 6, 2016 for the rehabilitation of Main Street between Division Street and Concord Place. The project is expected to be completed by June 24, 2016. The project will repair deteriorated concrete pavement and curb and gutter, diamond grind the entire pavement surface, install ADA compliant curb ramps at sidewalk crossings, construct concrete islands, and install pedestrian bump outs at two mid-block crosswalks.

The project will be constructed in three stages.

During the first two stages the outer lane (first stage south bound, second stage northbound) will be closed, traffic from the closed outer lane will be shifted to the center lane. Work during the first two stages will consist of concrete pavement repair, curb and gutter repair, and diamond grinding.

During the third stage, the center lane will be closed and traffic will use the outside lanes. Work in the third stage will consist of concrete pavement repair, diamond grinding and construction of islands and pedestrian bump outs.

Construction of ADA compliant curb ramps will occur during all three stages. During curb ramp construction the sidewalk and crossing will be closed, construction signage will direct pedestrians around the closure. For the duration of the project, no parking is permitted along Main Street within the project limits so that two-way traffic can be maintained.

During the project drivers should expect to encounter narrow lanes, grooved or uneven pavement, equipment in close proximity to travel lanes, and occasional flagging operations. For everyone's safety please drive at a reduced speed, do not talk on a cell phone, expect delays, and be please patient.

Additional landscaping and lighting projects on Main Street will begin in early fall. No major changes to traffic flows or detours are expected during these final phases.
